SPECIAL EASTER OFFERING FOR THE ENDOWMENT FUND

As a tradition for the past several years, the special offering at Easter (April 12) will increase the principal of the St. Andrew's Community Ministries fund that is the major part of the Endowment. That fund supports community organizations that serve needy individuals and families in Boone County. Investment returns on the principal of about \$110,000 were very good in 2019. Gifts supporting this special offering may be mailed to the church or made online through our online giving page.

In February, 2020, the Endowment Board supported proposals of six agencies (Rainbow House, Heart of MO Girls on the Run, Healthy Foods, Excel Center of Columbia, Alternative Community Training, and Valley Hope) with awards of \$1,000 each. In addition, over \$5,000 of investment income was added to the principal to assist in future years. As we rejoice in the promise of Easter, the Endowment Board appreciates your contribution to the principal since there is great local need and your gift is perpetual.

PASTOR'S DESK

Easter's Coming!

"Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said." ~Matthew 28:5-6

Wow! What a Lent it has been. Certainly, some who watch global health were anticipating where the world, where the nation, where the state, where our communities would be. But most of us lived in rather blissful ignorance about what was coming. And yet, here it is.

While Saint Andrew's has closed the building and no longer gathers in person to worship, there are ways that this congregation might actually be meeting more. More than twenty people and households are gathering at 7:30 on weekdays for morning prayer. People are touching base, catching up, celebrating birthdays. In short, this church is gathering to be the Body of Christ. This is the baptismal call for all people of God.

Yet there are challenges. Some are deeply fearful in this time. Sitting down and working out details that are so often assumed or overlooked can be daunting. Physical distancing can also have a social toll. Some literally need human contact on a regular basis for their sense of well-being. For each person, the concerns of this time affect them differently.

It can begin to feel overwhelming and even hopeless. Some call it a roller coaster ride. It affects people's emotions, their patience, their intellectual stamina, their physical well-being. It all can press down in ways that feel crushing.

As the calendar turns to April, the church turns its focus to the week of high highs and lowest lows in the life of those who accompanied Jesus. From the entrance into Jerusalem, with Jesus on a donkey, to the last supper, to the cross, it all had to

feel so overwhelming and hopeless. There is a way in which Holy Week shows us the reality of human experience. Betrayal, denial, pledges of allegiance ultimately failed, shows of support and compassion from unexpected people, grace and forgiveness offered. Still, that crushing Saturday when all seems lost. It all feels so familiar.

Christian people know that the story does not end in despair. Loss and fear and betrayal and all those human realities do not get the last word. Indeed, death does not get the final word.

God gets the final word. And that word is life. Resurrection life. Together Saint Andrew's Lutheran Church prepares to celebrate victory over death. Together Saint Andrew's prepares to remember with exuberance the ground of all hope. Together the people of God turn to focus on the Resurrection and life.

And that is how this people of God walks together through the difficulties. This newsletter is chock full of signs of life, signs of God's presence, signs that this congregation is thriving for the sake of witnessing to the Good News in Jesus Christ, witnessing to forgiveness, salvation and life, witnessing to hope. Be sure to join in worship in this holy time, whether online or by phone.

Easter is indeed coming! Thanks be to God!

WORSHIP DURING HOLY WEEK

During this season of worshiping together at a distance, the worship staff at Saint Andrew's has been brainstorming some ways that Holy Week can be observed both with the traditional liturgies and with members bringing their own parts.

Palm Sunday: Stop by the church, east entrance, while out shopping any time after Wednesday to pick up a palm branch for Palm Sunday worship. Marching around your house is optional! If you cannot get to the church, then you can draw a palm branch. Or if drawing is not your thing, there are plenty of coloring pages on the internet!



Maunder Thursday: On Maunder Thursday, the church hears a call to love one another through service. Bring a hand towel with you to worship. Who knows? The altar might get stripped too!

Good Friday: On Good Friday, the people of God hear about God's love and salvation worked on the cross. Bring a cross with you to worship and be prepared to hold it up to the camera during the Adoration of the Crucified.



Easter Vigil: At the Vigil of Easter, the church typically kindles the first fire and lights the Paschal Candle. Bring a candle to "carry" you through this service. Also, have a bell handy so when the Gospel Acclamation comes, we can ring in the resurrection together! Finally, have a bowl of water ready so that you can make the sign of the cross, remembering your baptism when we Affirm our Baptism.

Easter Sunday: Remember those Alleluias that we put away before Lent started? Time to get them out. But because of distancing, we ask you to make your own personal *Alleluia* to share. At the beginning of worship, we will give time to show your alleluias together. You may want to turn Zoom to a gallery view to see as many as possible. Let your Resurrection creative energy flow in preparation for this service.



Remember that all these services will be via Zoom. You can join both by internet and telephone. Watch for information on the SaintAndrewsLutheran.org website, and elsewhere in this newsletter.

GIVING TO SAINT ANDREW'S WHILE MEETING VIRTUALLY

Even though we cannot now meet in person at St. Andrew's, we still need to support our church. Our financial needs have not changed. We have the same staff and building to support.

During this period, we're counting on your continuing support. Below are several options.

- If you are accustomed to giving your offerings in the collection plate on Sunday mornings, you can simply mail your envelopes and checks (or checks alone) to the church:

- If you currently make weekly contributions but would rather just mail one check a month, that's fine. You do not need to write separate checks and envelopes for each week.
- If you're not already doing so, try online giving. From the church website www.SaintAndrewsLutheran.org, scroll to the bottom of the home page and click the "Donate now . . ." button. If you haven't done so already, you will be asked to create an account. You can make online donations from your bank or credit card to the general fund or to special appeals (e.g., Fifth Sunday offerings, Endowment Board, Growing

Hope Globally, etc.) You can also easily set up recurrent contributions.

- Some members find it convenient to use their banks' online bill paying service to have checks mailed directly to our church. Be sure and let us know if you want any of that amount to go to a special offering.
- Finally, if you are retired and take a required minimum distribution (RMD) from your retirement account, you can use some or all of those funds for tax deductible charitable contributions. Have your financial advisor send a check to St. Andrew's. Again, let us know if any of that goes to a special offering.

This is also a time of great uncertainty for so many people in this congregation, in this community and throughout the nation. For those whose circumstance makes regular giving during this time difficult, Saint Andrew's Lutheran Church understands, and in fact, wants to know how to best accompany you.



- We are starting the 17th year of working with farmers in Hartsburg and Salisbury and Growing Hope Globally (formerly Foods Resource Bank) to help overseas farmers learn how to feed their families. Growing Hope is the ecumenical organization that helps overseas farmers. One farmer whom Growing Hope has helped in Haiti is Yvalia, a widow with 14 children. She says: “Thanks to the training, I make better use of my land. I used to plant only lima beans and corn. Now, I’ve added peppers, tomatoes and papaya to sell. I’ve learned how to help my crops grow in spite of drought, by using compost, digging channels, adding organic materials to the channels to retain moisture, and planting in those channels.”
