### BLESSING FOR GRADUATES



## THAT SENIOR PASTOR'S MUSINGS

*And the four living creatures said, "Amen!" And the elders fell down and worshiped.*

~~Revelation 5:14 (NRSV)

Easter is a season filled with images of new life, of the Lord God who is and who was and who is to come. So many images of God's throne surrounded by all kinds of creatures singing praise to the Lamb fill the pages of Revelation. Yet, this lamb is also the shepherd in the church's hearing in John's Gospel. And John tells of the risen Jesus meeting the disciples on a beach, and asking Peter if he loves Jesus. Peter asserts that yes, he loves Jesus. And Jesus tells him, "Feed my lambs."

Through this Easter Season let us persist in gathering in the name of the risen Lord, worship and give thanks for God's gifts of grace and forgiveness, and for the blessing of being church together.

Thank you to all who have donated time, goods, money, and transportation to the refugee families! April has been a busy month. Three men are working full time jobs. The last man just got his Social Security Card so hopefully he will become employed soon too. Temporary Missouri Identification Cards have also been obtained.

A garden was requested and with the landlord's permission, was tilled and started. Two of the men in particular, are very happy to have a chance to grow fresh vegetables for their families. Thank you to all who have planted extra rows of okra and tomatoes or other vegetables in their own gardens for the refugee families. The families will happily accept donated garden produce also.

The families now have pillows for every member for sitting on the floor. A round of shoe shopping occurred as some of the kids outgrew their shoes and the employed men needed comfortable shoes for standing all day at their jobs.

Last, but not least, Catholic Charities staff are scheduling medical appointments. The children are all getting their first general care medical appointments, so we need lots of transportation volunteers.

**United with Christ in Baptism.** It has been almost three years since we gathered as a synod in assembly, having cancelled our 2020 assembly and then “gathering” on-line for our 2021 assembly. We have had to cancel many in-person events as we have navigated the pandemic, being reminded to practice “social distance” and wear masks which cover most of our faces, missing out on the smiles! It has not been easy.



**United with Christ in baptism.** We have experienced the reality that we are a deeply divided country and even within the church have struggled with differing views on how to address racial justice and even when and how we should speak publicly as the church. It has not been easy.



**United with Christ in baptism.** That is the truth that binds and guides us as the body of Christ. That is the truth revealed by your mission support, financial gifts to the synod, 50% of which are shared with the church-wide organization. This past year congregations gave \$1,548,906 which was \$50,850 less than last year. Our synod expenses were \$1,634,038 but we were able to cover all of these when we include our other receipts from the annual appeal, reimbursements, and grants. We had expected to partially supplement our income by using reserves from the last year, but through your generosity, we avoided using these and will apply those to support the work of the synod in future years. For all the challenges of these past couple of years, we have continued to be the church together, united with Christ in baptism. Thank you for your generosity.



**United with Christ in baptism we have:**

- Continued to support congregations through transitions, calling new pastors, raising up and training Synod Authorized Ministers, and working with leadership to clarify their purpose and a vision for moving forward.
- Supported the work of the racial justice team, the Lutherans Restoring Creation team, the Candidacy Committee, and the PMA team.
- Given grants to ministries across this synod and church including Bethany College, Wartburg Seminary, the Lutheran School of Theology, Hollis Renewal Center, Camp Tomah Shinga, Kansas Interfaith Action, and Missouri Voices of Faith.
- Provided resources and training to rostered ministers and other leaders at our Fall Theological Conference, Diversity Development Workshops, Ministry Enrichment Events.



**United with Christ in baptism** we are now preparing for an in-person assembly June 9-11 in Olathe, KS under the theme: *United with Christ, All Creation Groans, All Creation Sings*. We are helping to sponsor a synod-wide youth event July 24-27 at Camp Tomah Shinga. We are working together to discern where God is calling the church in these days, for indeed, we are **united with Christ in baptism**.

## DIALOGUE IN THE PURPLE ZONE

Gather on Saturday, **May 7, 14, and 21 from noon to 2:30 pm CDT** for this course on engaging deliberative dialog. From the promo material: "How can we talk with people

who differ from us politically, theologically or culturally? Are there ways we can engage issues of public concern in our congregations so that we can listen, respect, and learn from each other?"

"Based on her book, Preaching in the Purple Zone:

Ministry in the Red-Blue Divide, Rev. Dr. Leah Schade will introduce participants to deliberative dialogue in "The Purple Zone" to find common ground within the red/blue divide in our congregations. Deliberative

dialogue is a form of civil discourse that brings people together from diverse experiences and viewpoints to share their concerns about a topic, discern their shared values, and suggest steps for moving forward. Deliberative dialogue is an opportunity to listen deeply and share openly

and respectfully. In this way, we can build community, even when there are strongly held opinions from many perspectives.



"Rev. Dr. Leah Schade is the Associate Professor of Preaching and Worship at Lexington Theological Seminary. An ordained Lutheran minister for 20 years, Dr. Schade earned both her MDiv and PhD degrees from Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia (now United Lutheran Seminary). She has pastored churches in suburban, urban, and rural contexts. She is the author of five books, and is currently conducting a longitudinal research study about ministry, preaching, and social issues. She is also the EcoPreacher blogger for Patheos. In December 2021, Dr. Schade was

elected 2nd Vice President of the Academy of Homiletics, a three-year position that will culminate with serving as President of the Academy in 2024."
